A level Sociology Taster Work 2020

This pack concentrates on Paper 3 at A level. The work you do in response to the activities I set here, will be directly useful to you for your A level examination, so keep it safe!

Title of Tasks	Purpose of Task:	Time to be taken	Outcome Expected
Task 1: Evaluating the digital world	Applying examples.	2 hours	Table filled in with 10 examples of about 50 words of comment for each example.
Task 2: Wider research on relationships and identity in The Digital World	Exploration of the views of others on the effect of the digital world. Podcast and Ted Talk.	2 hours	300 words of notes minimum for each.
Task 3: Gender online- have women been benefitted or disadvantaged by the digital world?	To provide evidence to both agree and disagree with this statement. (podcasts and wider reading)	10 hours	To produce a positive and negative table on the evidence collected. Option to produce a longer essay (1500 words min) that presents the evidence and comes to a conclusion.

Task 1:

Is the digital world a positive or negative force for society?

Essentially, what is the effect of global social media on relationships between people, loneliness, identity, subcultures, democracy, rights of minority groups and political conflict?

Finding Evidence


Find examples of posts, videos, groups, statistics, news reports, petitions etc. on social media platforms and What's App that deal with relationships between people, loneliness, identity, subcultures, democracy, rights of minority groups and political conflict. The Covid-19 situation will bring a whole new aspect to the unit. New sociological times!

Twitter is a useful source as you get politics, culture, art etc and there are often links to articles. Newish platforms like TikTok would also be good (bear in mind who it is owned by, of course).

I do not want you to put yourself at risk by finding actual examples of posts that may be hateful or pornographic. We all know they are out there. Therefore you can just refer to those type of things in your own words, as I have below.

Recording Evidence:

Your job is to decide whether the pieces of evidence you collect from social media show a positive or negative effect for society. Here are some examples:

Digital Media offers a virtual community for those who are unable to find acceptance from those around them, for example #LGBTisolation	However, digital media is also used to create groups and spread opinions that are homophobic. Unlike in the real world, the virtual world is not 'policed' by the state. Hate laws are difficult to apply as the dark web is not easily restricted.

Task 3: Have women benefitted or been disadvantaged by the Digital World?

In order to complete the work on this task, you will need to listen to the podcasts and read the articles below. Record the evidence in a 'Benefitted' and 'Disadvantaged' table.

The digital world has benefitted women	The digital world has disadvantaged women	

If you wish, you can do an essay when you have finished your table. If you choose the essay option, follow this structure:

Introduction: Give your view on the title. (Do NOT leave this until the conclusion.)

Section 1:

'It **could** be argued that......' and lay out the points **against** your view. Explaining why this evidence COULD BE used to argue this view.

Section 2:

'However, the **stronger** argument is' Then give **your** view using the points **in favour** of your view.

Conclusion:

Summarise your view. Maybe you could end with a killer fact?
