YEAR 11 STRUCTURED DEPARTURE & BOOK RETURN DAY

As we approach the end of the examination period, we wanted to comment on the exemplary conduct of our Year 11 students throughout the duration of the exams. Their hard work and dedication has not gone unnoticed and we have been impressed with how they have approached the exams so far. We are very proud of this year group and know this exemplary conduct will continue into the last weeks of the examination period.

We also wanted to share details of a structured departure from school for Year 11. Please read the details below carefully.

From Thursday 16th June, Year 11 students will be allowed to leave school at the beginning of lunch unless they have an examination in the afternoon. Those wishing to stay on site for their school lunch are welcome to. This will be the case on Friday 17th June and Monday 20th June also.

On Tuesday 21st June only History and Music students are expected in school. History students can leave site following their examination. Music students can depart after their masterclass (Period 3). All other Year 11 students can remain at home to complete their own revision on this day only.

On Wednesday 22nd June, all students are expected in for their period 1 and 2 lessons and their Physics masterclass. Again, they can depart at lunch.

On Thursday 23rd June, following the Physics examination, all students with the exception of those remaining for the FSMQ masterclass will leave site.

Those students completing the FSMQ on Friday 24th June, may come in for their examination in the afternoon.

Book return day is on **Thursday 23rd June** following the Physics GCSE Examination.

Students will need to bring to school textbooks for the following subjects:

French
Maths
Music
Psychology
Spanish

If students have any unwanted GCSE revision guides that they could donate for future students, we will be happy to accept them.

They will be given instructions on where they should be returned to on the day. Students should also begin clearing their lockers over the next few days if they have not already done so. Our expectations for

behaviour and conduct on book return day remain unchanged and we will use the full range of sanctions available to us should a student fall short of these expectations. Please remind your son that poor behaviour on this day will have consequences, irrespective of whether they intend to return to OPGS or not.
